

This week we completed reading the story of 'The Matchbox Diary'. In this story we came across a little girl who visited her great-grandfather. She chooses a cigar box that turns out to hold a trove of matchboxes. Inside each is a memento; an olive pit, a bottle cap, a ticket. Together they recount her great-grandfather's journey from Italy to America through a diary-in-objects kept by the boy (the grandfather) who yearned to record his life but could not read or write.

One of our learning objectives for this week was **To ask relevant questions**. In this lesson we created a grid in which we answered the following; What I know, What I think I know, and What I would like to know. We received a letter from the publisher Walker Books, who the children to write about the people who travelled to America, their journey, and their life once they had moved and settled in America.

For our next piece of research (Next week's new L.O) I would like you all to do another research. Please be prepared with this in your homework book as we will be using this for another writing lesson.
