Top tips for using phonics to help with writing:

1. Encourage your child to sound out the word/s that they wish to write e.g. if they want to write hat, ask them what sound the word starts with. What is the next sound? Help your child to stretch out the sounds in the word by saying the word slowly e.g. hhhh-aaa-tttt.
2. Encourage using a capital letter at the start of each sentence and a full stop at the end.
3. If they are writing a sentence or a caption, support them with using finger spaces between each word.
4. Encourage your child to record words/sentence on the lines going from left to right.
