PE

Our little athletes in KS1 will be learning about 'team building' this term. Children will be looking at ways how they may communicate with peers, how they can encourage one another to build a healthy, strong relationship when it comes to teamwork. Children will explore being in groups promoting each other's ideas and respecting views and opinions. This will allow Children to energise and cooperate with each other to talk and share. It will bring them together and allows them to work as a team.

Half Term Curriculum Overview

Year 1 & 2 Autumn 1 - 2021/2022

Mathematics

This term our little mathematicians will cover the following units:

Number: Place Value

Number: Addition and Subtraction

Children will be able to count, read and write numbers in numerals. Children will be asked to say numbers and point to numbers on the number line. Children will be counting forwards and backwards using materials such as cubes, counters, and beads. Children will be identifying numbers using objects and pictures. Children will also be able to recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens and ones)

Islamic Link: Al-Haytham known as Alhazen (945-1040 CE) made great contributions to mathematics.

Science

For science this term we are looking at: What toys are made of? Children will identify and name a variety of everyday materials use to make toys e.g. wood, plastic, glass, metal, fabric, water and rock. We will also look at physical properties of these everyday materials.

We are going to compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.

Islamic Link: Ibn Hayyan also Known as Geber is called father of Islamic Alchemy. He wrote many great works that were passed over to later scholars and developed further.

PSHE

KS1 will be focusing on Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing this term. Starting with feelings and move on to; good and not so good feelings to help children reflect on how they feel about certain everyday things and situations. We will also learn that feelings come and go, even happy feelings can sometimes change to not so happy and good feelings. We will discuss big feelings and ways to manage them. Children will be able to reflect and identify what can help them feel better when they have a big feeling.

History

Children will explore the history of 'toys' from the past to the present. Children will think about familiar toys and use a variety of adjectives to describe them. In addition, children will find out what toys our parents and grandparents played with in comparison to toys which are played with in the modern times. Children will also identify old and new toys looking at pictures where they will be able to sort and order toys chronologically according to different dates on a timeline. Children will have the opportunity to investigate toys from different time periods where they will finally be given the chance to create their own toy museum using different materials
