

Written by someone who has recently been through the same thing as you, this set of friendly instructions will guide you through getting the best out of this year, making memories that will last forever!

· Stay Calm!

The number one piece of advice is to keep calm! This year puts a lot of pressure on you since you are now some of the oldest children in the school. You now have the responsibility to set examples for the younger children as well as studying and preparing for your end of year tests. Stay calm and work on learning some different ways that you can use to relax and enjoy yourself.

This could start with 'How to...'





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The introduction should be a paragraph which gives some details about the following instructions.

It's good to speak to the reader directly. You could ask a rhetorical question!





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Can you find some examples of imperative verbs in the model text?





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Adverbs/adverbials can help you describe when/how/ where to do the instruction.

You may wish your instruction to be carried out after another, or at the beginning of the year for example.





Our instructions will be slightly different to a regular set of instructions.

We are giving friendly advice so we may have a more informal tone to our writing.
