There are swings, slides and see-saws to ride. Sometimes there are big rides that go very fast!



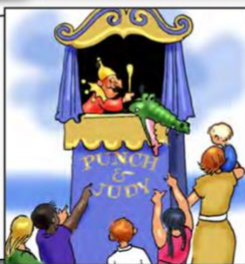
On the Pier
