# Imperative Verbs

Imperative verbs are also known as 'bossy verbs' because they tell people what to do! e.g. shut the window or turn the kettle on.

Look at the sentences below. Can you think of some imperative verbs that could go at the beginning to make an instruction?

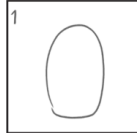

Can you think of a situation you might need to use an imperative verb?

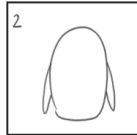


# How to Draw a Penguin

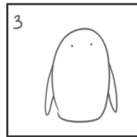
20 1. Start by drawing a long oval shape with a flat base in the middle of the page. This is the body.



34 2. Add a long triangle to each side of the body. These are the wings.



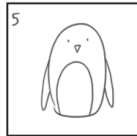
47 3. Give your penguin two dots for eyes near the top of the body.



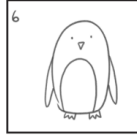
59 4. Add a small triangle shape underneath the eyes for the penguin's beak.



74 5. Draw a tummy onto your penguin by adding a tall, curved arch inside its body.



85 6. Finally, add two pointy feet to the base of your penguin.
