What is the number?

- the number has 2 digits
- the number is more than 5
- the ones digit is more than double the tenths digit
- the digits add up to 11
- the ones digit is even

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Decimal Place Value Riddle

What is the number?

- the number has 3 digits
- the number is less than 30
- the tenths digit is equal to the sum of the tens and ones digits
- the number has odd and even digits
- the number is greater than 20
- the ones digit is half of 10

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
